

Flip Card Tutorial

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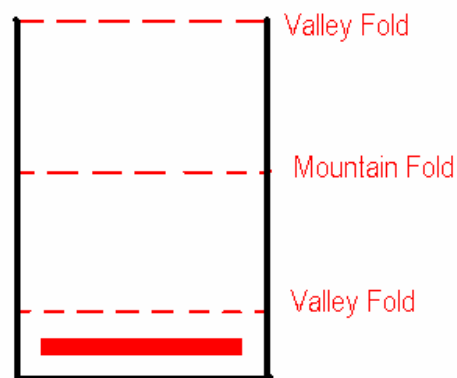
Base – 4 ¼ x 5 ½

Tag – 2 ½ x 5

Center stamped image element must be 2 ½ or wider

Flip – 4 x 5 ¼

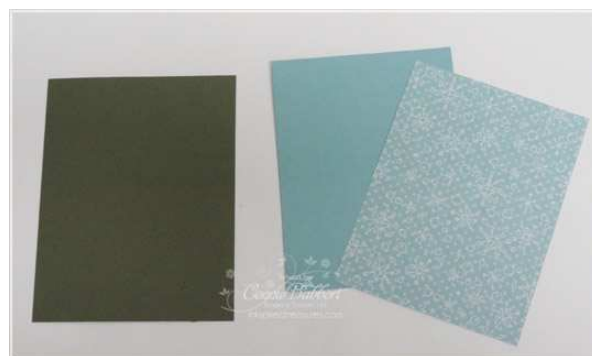
- Cut from bottom: ¾ inch to 4" at the 1" mark on left side and also at the 3" mark.
- Turn and cut at bottom ¾ inch mark to connect the two side cuts.
- This creates a U shape cut in the center of the card
- Score across the top of the U shape.
- Score ¾ from bottom cut in center only (3 ¾ mark)
- Score ½ way between the 2 score lines in center only (2 ½ mark)
- If using DSP for the flip portion, adhere to cardstock before you begin.



Adhere with Sticky Strip on bottom of flip to top of tag piece.

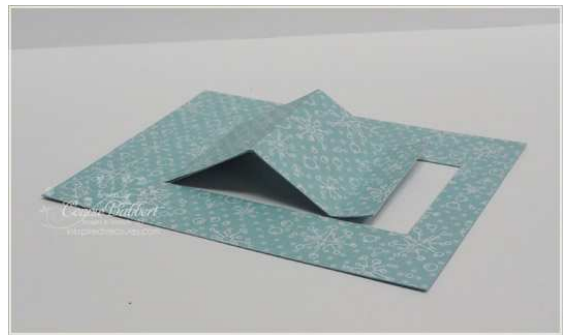
Step 1

Cut Base and Flip elements to measurements above. Since I wanted to use designer paper for my flip piece, I adhered the designer paper to the same size piece of cardstock for extra sturdiness.



Step 2

Cut and score the flip piece. (I used the DSP and cardstock sandwich.) The scoring of the center piece should be valley, mountain, valley when you are finished.



Step 3

Round the top corners of the Tag piece.



Step 4

Apply Sticky Strip to the back side of the flip element on the narrow bottom piece.



Step 5

Place the front of the tag piece onto the Sticky Strip on the back of the flip. It only adheres at that one place. The tag should be centered around both sides of the opening.



Step 6

Decorate the front element. It must be wider than 2 ½ when finished.

(Not shown...I ended up adding another layer of Cherry Cobbler cardstock under the Always Artichoke layer for an additional pop of color!)



Step 7

Apply Sticky Strip to the front upward slope of the flip element as shown, being careful not to cross the scored lines.



Step 8

Add front element to the flip element, making sure that bottom of front element is slightly above the score line so that it moves freely.



Step 9

View from back side.



Step 10

Add the base card (Always Artichoke), making sure that you adhere only the bottom and sides so that it doesn't interfere with the tag movement.

Add a hole and ribbon to the tag for pulling.

Finish decorating the front as desired.



Step 11

Stamp images and greeting inside the area pulled up on the tag and inside the window that is revealed with tag is pulled.



Step 12

Your finished Flip Card!
